Breakfast Club and Kids Club –

Please can we remind parents that ideally these need to be booked in advance using ParentPay. We need to ensure that we have enough staffing in place and this is tricky when we don't know the number of children attending. Thank you

Breakfast Club runs from 8am – 8.45am at a cost of £3 per child.

Kids Club runs from 3.15pm – 5pm each day (except the last day of each term). The cost is £4 until 4.15pm and then an additional cost of £3 until 5pm (£7 for the full session). You can only book the initial session on ParentPay. After attending we will then add the additional cost.

START OF YEAR REMINDERS

Uniform- we would ask that all children come to school in full uniform everyday (unless informed otherwise). This includes BLACK shoes please. We have lots of spare second-hand uniform that is available free of charge for anyone who would like it.

Jewellery - children should not be wearing ANY jewellery to school and will be asked to remove this and take it home. If children have pierced ears, they may wear small studs (no hoop earrings please, it is easy for them to get caught).

Snack - all children in Releath and Trenoweth will be given fruit for snack, provided free by the government fruit and vegetable scheme. There will also be a small selection of fruit and vegetables available for children in Pengelly and Crenver. Children may bring their own snack if you prefer, but this must be fruit/vegetables. PLEASE REMEMBER DUE TO CHILDREN WITH ALLERGIES, WE ARE A NUT FREE SCHOOL.

Reading diaries need to be in school every day so we can check that children are reading at home. We expect children to read 4 times a week at home (Reception children will not be bringing home books straight away!).

PE kits need to be brought in to school and ideally left in school so that they are always available when needed.

Medicines- Please ensure if your child has asthma, that an inhaler is in school and we have completed an asthma form. All other medicines must be handed into the school office (without prior agreement from the Head of School, we are only allowed to administer prescribed medication).

Absence from school - if your child is absent from school please report this BY PHONE 01209 831 455 to the school office. You can leave an answerphone message or speak to the office staff. (Please do not report via Class dojo etc due to messages being missed with staff absence etc). Due to government guidelines we need a full reason for absence, such as high temperature, vomiting etc. If a child has vomiting or diarrhea they must be absent for 48hrs after the last bout of illness. All absence for exceptional circumstances need to be reported via a form available from the office or on the school website. Thank you.
